An overview of needs in Europe

Why this project?

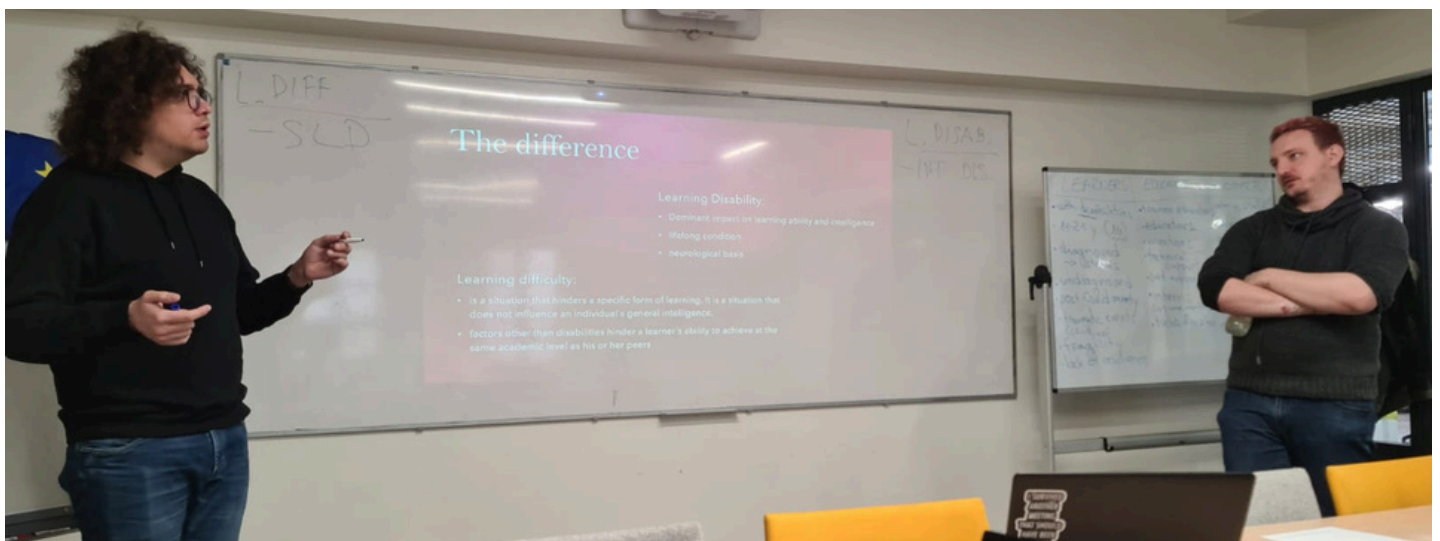
Young people with Special Educational Needs are more likely to have their needs addressed and be “protected” while at school. That is not necessarily available in the community or workforce. This means that the transition from school to adult life and employment can be particularly challenging.

A report on transition from School to Employment by the European Agency for Special Needs and Inclusive Education identified that these challenges are consistent across Europe. They include poor access to continuing education and training, segregated vocational training that leads to inadequate qualifications, higher unemployment rates, and low aspirations and expectations.

That illustrates why this issue is important now, across Europe. Our team is going to work on three main outcomes that will try to fill this gap: an Assessment tool, Coaching and Mentoring Programme and Transition Toolkit.

Assessment Tool

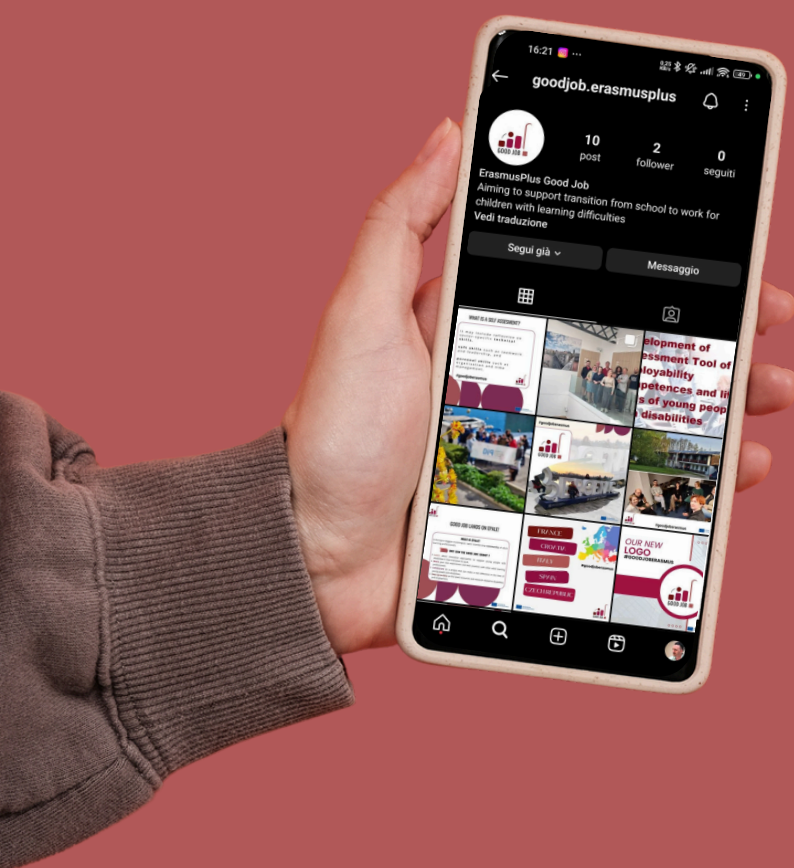
What are we doing? What are the next steps?
