Did you know?

Some data from Europe

Across the European Union, persons with disabilities still face major barriers to employment. According to the EU Labour Force Survey (2022), only 50.8% of adults with disabilities are employed, compared to 74.8% of those without disabilities. This represents a persistent employment gap of 24 percentage points, despite legal frameworks like the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and the EU Strategy for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities 2021–2030.

In some countries, the gap is even wider. For example, Eurostat data show that in Romania, Ireland and Bulgaria, less than 40% of persons with disabilities are in employment. Moreover, young adults with disabilities are especially vulnerable during the transition from school to work, often facing discrimination, inaccessible environments, or a lack of tailored support services.

The European Disability Forum (EDF) points out that this exclusion is not due to lack of capacity, but to systemic barriers — including negative attitudes, insufficient workplace adjustments, and a lack of inclusive policies.




Transition Mentor Toolkit


What's next?
