Every young person deserves the chance to grow, learn, and find their place in the world of work — including those with disabilities and learning difficulties

From supported internships and vocational training programmes to mentorship schemes and inclusive employment services, new pathways are opening for transitioning learners. When these opportunities are personalised, accessible, and supported by skilled mentors, they can make a real difference — building confidence, independence, and long-term employability.

Across Europe, there are several initiatives and frameworks supporting the transition from school to work for young people with disabilities — yet access remains fragmented.

The European Agency for Special Needs and Inclusive Education promotes the concept of "transition planning as a process, not an event", and supports Member States in developing coordinated strategies.

Meanwhile, Erasmus+ and national programmes fund projects like Divee, Accessible Work 4 All, and InclusiVRity, focusing on mentoring, digital skills, and inclusive workplaces.

Meeting in Turin



Two new tools available!


